Note from the Baywood Board by Sue McConnell, President

We are pleased to announce the mansards of the villas and clubhouse will be power washed by Top to Bottom Powerwashing beginning on Monday, April 18. They have confirmed they do not use substances harmful to plants and will take appropriate precautions to protect them. However you may take additional precautions as you wish as long as it doesn't impede their ability to get to the mansards to clean them.

A few things to consider as we prepare:

- -move anything that you may be concerned about getting wet -they estimate 8-10 days to complete the entire complex. They plan to start on the waterfront units and proceed to Tidewood Ave (from south to north) moving to Southwood and back up Driftwood to complete the loop.
- they are open to small side jobs such as your privacy fences, courtyards, etc. Please be prepared to ask them when they are at your villa and to pay cash. Be sure to have your space prepared so they are not unduly delayed in their main purpose.

We are looking forward to having sparkling clean mansards when all is done.

We have changed the start of the monthly Board meeting to begin at 1 pm because we were bumping up against the set up for Thirsty Thursday. Thursday is the best time for the Board members to meet and this will allow for a break and better set up time for the Hospitality Committee. The new 1 pm start time will take effect on Thursday, April 28.

In the inaugural edition of the Baywood Buzz we reported that the fountain would be temporarily shut down due to needed repairs and the

daily labor to keep it running. Since then, we discovered that it would take close to \$1000.00 to properly shut the fountain down. Jonathan Birch has selflessly given his time shouldering the majority of the daily maintenance to keep the fountain operational while we can decide on a more permanent solution. Please join the board in recognizing and appreciating the incredible time and work Jonathan has generously provided to our community.

We are still waiting for the county to sign off/stamp our document changes allowing for the patio, truck and pet amendments passed by the owners in January. As soon as we have confirmation of their approval, we will let you know!

Preparing your unit to leave

This is the time of year that our seasonal residents are heading back north. We will miss you!

The following are some things to consider when preparing your villa for your absence:

Hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30!

Review the hurricane preparedness rules and regulations and ensure your unit is ready. That includes removing any objects, even the small ones, that might become a missile in a storm. Commonly missed items include: solar lights, statues, yard decorations, outside rugs, grills, garbage cans, hanging baskets/chimes, etc. If you have a patio, all furniture should be moved into your laundry room or inside your villa. Safety First! Ways to protect your villa while you are gone.

Make arrangements for someone to check on your unit every few weeks to be sure all is well inside and outside. If you leave a car in the carport, be sure this friend or neighbor has a key to your car so it can be moved to higher ground in case of a hurricane. If you don't have a neighbor or friend nearby, let us know as we have year-round residents who would be willing to check or connect you with professional services contacts.

Seal off your drains and toilets with some kind of impervious cover like plastic wrap, etc. This will help prevent bugs from entering through the drains.

Leave your air conditioning set around 80 degrees or so to keep the humidity level down and to prevent mold. Ceiling fans left on low speed use very little electricity and help move the air conditioning into the corners/closets where mold can take hold.

Turn off your water at the main shut-off valve.

Provide a key or access code for your front door to BCVA (Sue McConnell, Martha McKlveen or Barb Stio) in case we need emergency access while you are absent. Keys and codes are stored without ID tags in a locked box in a locked room for security. We have had incidents where we needed emergency access to help save a unit from further damage (think sewer water coming up into the owners unit, yuck!).

Casey Management should be the first line of contact for inquiries, maintenance needs and concerns.
